The course describes ART practice and results in Europe, observed through the ESHRE-EIM European register on ART. It details the main aspects to consider when building a national register, including methodological and ethical ones. The strengths and weaknesses will be discussed, as the potential links with other registers. Several national experiences will be shared.

Finally, several aspects of the EIM register will be discussed in round tables, including organization, forms, additional studies and future

- (1) To show the importance of building national and European registers in getting data on the practice and results in a major field for human being, reproduction and its treatments
- (2) To detail the main aspects to consider when building a register on ART
- (3) To progress in the EIM register functioning
